

The South Garo Hills district lies in the southern part of the state of Meghalaya, and was created on 18th June, 1992. The district is hilly with difficult terrain with its headquarter at Baghmara, the only town in the district. The district is situated between 25°10′ and 25°35′N latitudes and 90°15 and 91°0′ E longitude. It covers an area of 1887 sq. Km. It is bounded in the North by East Garo Hills, in the East by the west Khasi Hills district, in the West by West Garo Hills district and in the South by Bangladesh.

WARI CHORA

One of the most popular destinations in Meghalaya, Wari Chora has gained popularity through travel vloggers. Apparently some videos have garnered about 3 lakh views. Wari chora is a deep riverine system beneath the gorge. Its beauty can only be accessed through rafts/kayak and boats. The boat ride from the entrance to the Parom Dare waterfall takes about 10 mins where one can see the pristine beauty of the cave like rock formations created by nature for over millions of years. It is located in Paromgre A'king land and shares the border with Rekmangre village. One can visit this spot through Chokpot Bazaar traveling from Tura or from Emangre village which has become a transit for visitors coming from Siju and Baghmara






WARI CHORA


It is popularly known as the land of Seven Serpents which in Garo folklore denotes Sangkni or the mythological serpent known to be huge akin to Loch Ness Monster. Locals narrated the story that during the olden days people would travel to Durgapur now in Bangladesh for trade and there were no any suitable water body to set their trips in the area. They discovered Wari Chora later and started their boat ride through this river Rongdik which joins Simsang river that enters Bangladesh. Hence the places was called Wari Choram meaning a place deep water where one can start their boat journey.

<u>How to visit</u>: Emangre village is located 40 kms from the district headquarter Baghmara. If one travels through Siju village it would be about 25 kms through Karukol village and after monsoon the distance can be shorter as one can thravel from Siju to Emangre via Tolegre village.



2. AWEMONG ZERO POINT

Awemong Zero Point: This beach, located on the bank of the Simsang River, offers a variety of adventure activities such as camping, kayaking, river rafting, rock climbing, rappelling and other beach sports. It is also close to other tourist attractions and can serve as a base camp for exploring the nearby abandoned coal mines that have a lot of historical significance.



3. SIJU BIRD SANCTUARY

If you are a fan of birds and nature, you will love the Siju Bird Sanctuary, situated across the Simsang river in South Garo Hills. The sanctuary is part of the Siju wildlife reserve, which boasts of a diverse flora and fauna. The sanctuary welcomes both native and migratory birds, who seek refuge here during the winter months. You can admire many common birds, as well as some rare and protected ones, in this scenic place.

<u>How to Visit:</u> Roughly a 4 kms trek from Siju Cave crossing the Simsang River. *Permission has to be obtained from Forest Officials in Siju*.

4. SIJU CAVE

Siju Cave, located in Siju Village of South Garo Hills, is one of the longest and most studied caves in Asia. It has limestone formations from the pre-Cambrian era, as revealed by scientific research. The cave hosts a fragile ecosystem with thousands of bats of the species macro brachia cavernicula. The locals call this cave Do.bakkol or Siju Do.bakkol

How to Visit: The distance from Siju market on NH 217 to this cave is 5kms approx.






5. BALPAKRAM NATIONAL PARK

Balpakram National Park is a must-visit destination for nature lovers and culture enthusiasts in Meghalaya. Located in the South Eastern part of Garo Hills, 60 kilometers from Baghmara, the park is a biodiversity hotspot that hosts a rich variety of flora and fauna. The name Balpakram means land of the perpetual winds in Garo language, and it is also considered as the final resting place for the souls of the departed by the Garos. The park is also steeped in myths and legends of the Garo warriors who fought against the evil forces that threatened their land.



6. REDINGSNI WARI

Redingsni Wari, a scenic spot with crystal clear waters, is located 8 kilometers from Chokpot Market. It is one of the most popular tourist attractions in South Garo Hills. The pool is deep and surrounded by rock cliffs on both sides, making it hard to access. However, you can swim and enjoy the water upstream and downstream, where the water remains clear throughout the year, even during the rainy season. It is a trip worth taking for nature lovers.



How to Visit: Travel from Chokpot Market to Kakija village of about 8kms and then trekking 2kms to the spot.

7. IMILCHANG DARE

This waterfall, located in Eman Asakgre, 16 kilometers from Chokpot Market, is a stunning sight that has been featured in calendars and local magazines. Eman Asakgre was once a cultural hub in this region, where the Nokpante (Bachelor's Dormitory) stood. The Nokpante was a place where young boys learned from grown men about the life, folklore, music and cultural traditions, weaving, carpentry and more.



How to Visit: Travel 16kms from Chokpot Market to Asakgre village.

Then about 500 meters from the parking area to the spot.

Distance from Hqtr: 67 kms Nearest Village: Eman Asakgre



8. AGINMA WARI

If you are looking for a refreshing and scenic spot to enjoy nature, you might want to visit the Rongdik Pool, located near Emangre Village, 42 kilometers from Baghmara, the district headquarters of South Garo Hills. This stunning pool is fed by a perennial stream that is home to many large fishes, some as big as an adult human. You can swim in the crystal-clear water during the summer, or admire the canyon-like formations on both sides of the pool. The pool has attracted many local and foreign tourists, and has been featured in several calendars and magazines for its beauty.



How to Visit: Travel 42 kms from Baghmara via Karukol village towards Emangre village.

Distance from Hqtr: 42 kms Nearest Village: Emangre




9. JAWA WARI

Jawa Wari, a 600-meter pool fed by the Rongdik stream, is a popular spot for swimming, located 2 kilometers from Aginma Wari. It attracts many local and foreign tourists, who also enjoy the local folklore behind its name. According to legend, a fisherman was attacked by a tiger (Jawa in Garo language) while fishing at this spot. He was "Kal'aka by Jawa", which means he was killed by the tiger. The pool is conserved by the locals, who prohibit fishing. You can see fishes of various sizes in the clear water during the dry season.



Distance from Hqtr: 44 kms Nearest Village: Aruakgre





10. TENGTE RONGRET

This waterfall, located near Kakija area of Kantasigre under Chokpot C&RD Block, South Garo Hills, has a connection to the Garo folklore. According to the locals, this area was once inhabited by Tengti Rongret or Teteng, who are elf-like creatures with backward feet. The Teteng are very elusive and only a few people have seen them in the jungles and dense forests of Garo Hills

HOW TO REACH

Distance from Hqtr: 64 kms Nearest Village: Kakija






<u>How to Visit:</u> To reach this spot, you will have to trek for 3 kilometers from Kakija village, which is located 8 kilometers away from Chokpot Bazaar.

11. KORE NOKMONG WATERFALL

Kore Nokmong is located in Jadigindam village which can be accessed through Siju village. Distance from Siju market would be 5 kms approximately

Distance from Hqtr: 36 kms Nearest Village: Jadigindam




12. GONGJA WATERFALL

This waterfall, located on a hillock above Tolegre and Nokatgre Villages, has a fascinating story behind it. According to legend, there was once a wicked deity named Dura Mring who was unhappy with the slow and steady flow of the water, which people used to draw with a bamboo pipe. Dura Mring decided to kneel down and chop the water with his/her hand, creating the gushing waterfall that we see today.

How to Visit:

1 km from Nokatgre Village which is close to Tolegre. Distance from Baghmara 52 kms approx. Requires hiking of steep hill roughly a kilometre from Tolegre/ Nokatgre Village.

13. RENANG WATERFALL

Renang Dare, a waterfall with a thrilling legend, got its name from a daring couple. According to the story, a husband made a wooden boat and wanted to go down the waterfall with his wife. She was afraid and refused, but he threatened to chop her up with the machete he used for his boat. She had no choice but to join him, and they miraculously survived the waterfall. People called them Re'nanggaka, which means they were lucky, and the waterfall became known as Renang Dare.

How to Reach:

From Tolegre one has to travel roughly 7 kms to a village called Dabalgre.



Distance from Hqtr: 60 kms Nearest Village: Dabalgre

14. MATRONG MANPAT WATERFALL

This waterfall, located near Rongding Awe area, 2 kilometers from Dangsa Awe on NH217, has a connection to the local wildlife. The waterfall is named after the Matrong, which are mountain goats that used to live in the area. The Matrong are skilled climbers of the steep cliffs near the waterfall, where they would go to find food. The waterfall was named Marong Manpat or Matrong Malbat, which means the waterfall of the grazing animals on the rock cliff.



15. JADESIL WARI


Jadesil Wari, located in Tolegre village, 50 kilometers from Baghmara, is a scenic spot with a local legend. It is said that tigers (Matcha Chidual in Garo language) used to train their cubs to jump across the two rocks above the stream, and only then they were deemed ready for the wild. The spot has been developed as a fish sanctuary by the Fishery Department, Government of Meghalaya, and attracts many domestic and foreign tourists who enjoy feeding the fish and capturing the beauty of the place.

HOW TO REACH


Distance from Hqtr: 53 kms Nearest Village: Tolegre




How to Visit: Jadesil Fish Sanctuary can be reached from Baghmara as well as from Siju via Nengrugittim. Distance would be 50kms from Baghmara and 10 Kms from Siju Village respectively.


