Khasi Hills:

Shillong Golf Course (Glen Eagles of the East):

The Shillong Golf Course, one of India's oldest, is a stunning 18-hole course surrounded by pine and rhododendron trees, famed for its natural beauty and ranking among the largest golf courses in the world.

Laitlum Canyon: Discover the 'End of Hills', where dramatic cliffs meet open sky, offering a tranquil escape that clears the mind and invites a deep sense of connection with nature's vastness.

Mawlynnong: This village exemplifies community-based ecotourism and sustainable living, where locals have turned their homes into clean, eco-conscious spaces, preserving culture and offering a unique, immersive glimpse into rural life in Meghalaya.

Mawmluh Cave: Mawmluh Cave, India's fourth largest at 7.2 km, marks the Meghalayan Age's Global Stratotype Point. Adorned with ancient stalactites and stalagmites, it holds immense geological value as a defining site in Earth's history

Umngot River: The crystal-clear
Umngot River in Meghalaya
flows transparently revealing the
aquatic wonder underneath.
Surrounded by lush hills, it offers a
surreal experience and is one of
India's cleanest rivers.

Jaintia Hills:

Krem Liat Prah: Krem Liat Prah is one of the world's longest limestone caves. It is said to be of approximately 34 km. The extensive cavern system is also known as the Cave of the Tiger. As you step into the caverns of Krem Liat Prah, prepare to be awed by the stunning limestone formations that look like nature's version of abstract art.

Krem Puri: It is known as the world's longest sandstone cave spanning over 24.5 km. Marvel at the beautiful rock formations sculpted by time and water, a real exploration hidden beneath Meghalaya. Beyond its geological marvels, Krem Puri houses fossils of the Mosasaurus, a marine reptile from the Cretaceous period, offering a glimpse into Earth's ancient past.

Garo Hills:

Nokrek Biosphere Reserve: Home to a dazzling array of avian species and a natural paradise for diverse wildlife, this sanctuary offers an escape for nature lovers and anyone who needs a break from the concrete jungle. Here, within this ecosystem, a complex web of life connects every creature, from the smallest insect to the majestic elephant.



Monolith Park: The Nartiang Monoliths are a remarkable assemblage of megalithic structures. Located in Nartiang, these monoliths transcend their physical form; they constitute a tangible link to the past. These structures were erected between the 16th and 19th centuries by various clans to commemorate significant events and honor ancestors.



Siju Caves: Siju Cave, also known as Siju Dobakkol or the "Bat Cave," is a renowned limestone cave located in the South Garo Hills near the Simsang River and Napak Lake. Spanning approximately 4,772 m, it ranks among India's longest cave systems and is celebrated for its impressive stalactite and stalagmite formations and is home to tens of thousands of bats.

Wari Chora: Wari Chora is an adventure waiting to happen. You can trek through the forest, enveloped by the sound of nature. The journey is part of the experience, surrounded by greenery. It is an opportunity to immerse in these clear waters embraced by the forest and the absence of urban clamour.
