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
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Winter Tales

December

May


Culinary Cascade is a three -day celebration of Meghalaya's rich culinary heritage. It is a culinary movement, the first of its kind, that honors age-old culinary traditions, sustainability, and the deep ties between the people and nature. The event features local produce, traditional spices, regional brews, and cuisines from the Khasi, Jaintia, and Garo tribes, alongside global culinary influences. Visitors can enjoy live cooking demos, food innovation showcases, expert discussions, and street food reinvented. With free entry, 'Culinary Cascade' invites all to experience Meghalaya's evolving food story rooted in tradition, enriched by collaboration, and bursting with creativity.





Shillong Cherry Blossom Festival

November The Shillong Cherry Blossom Festival is one of its kind. It marks the autumnal bloom of the wild Himalayan cherry blossoms (Prunus cerasoides) in Shillong. First launched in 2016. this homegrown festival was envisioned as a way to promote eco-tourism, celebrate the region's natural beauty, and foster a dynamic cultural connection. Unlike the spring cherry blossoms of countries like Japan. Shillong's streets are graced by pink blooms in November. Over time, the festival has evolved into a lively celebration of music, food, art. fashion, and cultural performances, attracting visitors and highlighting Meghalaya's



Every year the Shillong Cherry Blossom Festival welcomes diplomatic presence, international and local artists who grace the stage with lively performances. The previous editions include artists Ne -Yo, Ronan Keating, Akon, Clean Bandit, Boney M, R3hab, Jasleen Royal, Kanika Kapoor, Korn SK, and Queen Sensation.

Festivals like the Shillong Cherry Blossom Festival celebrate the region's natural wonders while providing a platform to showcase and strengthen this heritage. By blending traditional art forms with contemporary expressions, the festival encourages the youth to honour tradition while embracing global influences.

Monolith Festival

March

Me•Gong Festival

November Named after the bauhinia purpurea flower, the Me•Gong festival is a lively tribute to the region's rich biodiversity and conservation of its natural resources. The festival symbolizes the close connection shared between the people and the hills they inhabit. Held annually in November or December, this festival showcases the people's music, art, and dance. The festival features traditional and modern music, drawing visitors from across India and beyond. It has increasingly attracted renowned national and international artists. The Me•Gong festival offers a perfect platform to explore the distinct identity of the Garo Hills, where tradition, culture, and nature seamlessly blend.
